- Annual Public Meeting after much discussion the group decided on tentative plan for a
 meeting in spring 2012 that would discuss interagency collaborations and common
 topics. A tentative date was set March 22, 2011, locations discussed, and a tentative
 meeting plan was sketched out
 - 1. Provide short Agency updates that highlight risk assessment activities and their contribution to food safety
 - 2. Discuss the continuum of risk assessment tools utilized by our agencies, possibly focusing on risk profiles as an alternative to quantitative risk assessment that can better suited to the needs of the risk managers/agency in some instances
 - 3. Description of the National Residue Program, highlighting the collaborative nature of this program
 - 4. Description of the development of dose-response relationship for *Listeria monocytogenes*, highlighting collaborations and issues involved.
- Co-sponsoring Meetings/Symposia: IRAC-sponsored Symposium for IAFP 2012 (proposed by Yuhuan Chen): Making a Difference: Data Collection for Risk Assessments through Innovative Approaches – proposal shared with IRAC members before the meeting

- Maintain a list of food safety risk assessment data gaps and research needs
- Briefly discussed the use of IRAC to provide technical feedback on draft risk assessments developed by member agencies and reaffirmed the utility of this process for some agencies and our commitment for IRAC to continue to serve in this capacity.
